

Problematic Internet Use Questionnaire Short-Form (PIUQ-SF-9)

In the following you will read statements about your Internet use. Please indicate on a scale from 1 to 5 how much these statements characterize you.

1. How often do you feel that you should decrease the amount of time spent online?	1	2	3	4	5

Evaluation: Total score can be calculated by adding up all 9 items and it ranges from 9 to 45. If the total score equals or exceeds 22 points, the respondent can be considered to be at risk of problematic Internet use. Subscale scores can be calculated by adding up the items belonging to the

respective subscale. Both the subscale scores and the total score can be used in their continuous forms as well.
